Struggle is REAL!!!

"My dear children, I'm writing this to you so that you will not sin. yet, if anyone does sin, we have Jesus Christ, who has God's full approval. He speaks on our behalf when we come into the presence of the Father" 1 John 2:2

Do you think an habitual criminal could remain straight if he had a key to the local bank? oh, he might be able to resist the stacks of money for a day or two. but, eventually, because of his inclination to steal, the temptation would be too great. What about you? What is your greatest temptation, you weakest point? When faced with this temptation day after day, do you have the power to resist it—always? NO! If you take time to study the previous passage in 1 John, you'll see that the nature of all mankind is to sin, to slip and fall—every man, every day—that means even you. What is the point? The point is this: Fallen man does not have the power to become righteous and sinless on his own. You need an Advocate—one who will defend you, clear your name before the Judge, and help you stay straight.

Every one of us will stand before the Judge one day. It will be to our great advantage if our Judge is also our Savior.

Sin is a terrible thing. We see it blazed across the headlines of the news reports every day, murder, mayhem, assault, fraud, cheating, lying, deceit, adultery, divorce, fighting, wars. Sin is

so corrupt and common that every conceivable sin is seen or heard about in one form or another practically every day. Sin is so much a part of human life that we can hardly pay attention to it unless it is some major crime or else involves our own lives and families. Sin is just everywhere. No matter where we turn we see people mistreating others—criticizing, backbiting, and gossiping about them. We see people verbally tearing other people down. We see husbands and wives living together but lacking true love. They are just together, living in coldness and being withdrawn from one another. We see all kinds of selfishness in children and fellow workers. WE see lying, deception, stealing, cheating, and all sorts of sexual immorality. We see people dressing in tight clothes or else exposing parts of the human body in order to attract attention, and then we see all kinds of promiscuity and rapes, assaults and murders. the list of sins and shortcomings in life could fill a book.

Over the next several months we'll take a deeper dive into 1 John 1:10-2:2. Until next time know that there are many who think they *don't*

need a Savior. However, I'm here to tell you that if you leave this world today without knowing Jesus, you'll wish you had met Him while you were here. I look forward to sharing with you the great hope that the Lord has given us through Jesus Christ and the free gift of salvation. Until next time God bless.

Obedience

verses Willfulness

“Do everything without complaining or arguing.” Philippians 2:14

Have you ever been the victim of murmuring? Do you remember what it felt like? You probably had feelings of hurt and anger and a determination to protect yourself. Maybe you felt like this person:

“Betrayed!” The once transparent member of the neighborhood church was crushed. Sue had been so open to trust other Christians with her personal struggles. She had always been taught to share her burdens, but how could anyone take her personal pain and make it the talk of the church grape-vine? “Never again will I trust my heart with another person,” she vowed. And at that very moment, another member of the body of Christ withdrew into a hard shell of isolation: another victim of murmuring and gossip.

What does it mean to *murmur*? We hear that word quite a bit in the church, but what does it mean? Well, to *murmur* means to mutter, grumble, and complain. It is the quiet, soft, behind-the-back, undertone of murmuring and grumbling. It is the kind of criticism, dissatisfaction, fault-finding and gossip that goes on within small groups or cliques.

Complaining and arguments are not to be allowed in the church. As this verse says; *Do everything without complaining and arguing.* If complaining begins among a clique or even between two people, the spiritual leaders of the church are to deal with it just as Christ laid out. It is not to be allowed to fester. Complaining, unless they are stopped, will lead to arguing and turmoil and divisiveness.

Complaining and arguing are never of God—never!!! This is what this passage and this charge is all about. All things—nothing is left out—are to be done without murmuring and disputes.

Murmuring and disputes were the very sins that brought judgement on so many

Jews in the wilderness wanderings of Israel.

The person who murmur and disputes (complains and argues) is not working at his salvation or deliverance. They are doing the very opposite: they are working to bring judgment on themselves. They are working in their own willfulness.

The results of murmuring are far worse than people ever think. This is the primary reason God forbids murmuring and disputes (complaining and arguing) in no uncertain terms. Murmuring hurts, damages, divides, tears down, misleads people, opposes God’s will, hinders progress, stymies growth, elevates selfish opinion, is self-centered, says “look at me,” pushes people away from Christ and the church.

So, what then should we do? If you read on in Philippians 2 we read that we should *be blameless and innocent.* We’re called to work out our own salvation by working at being pure. We’re called to be blameless: free from fault and censure, above reproach and rebuke. We’re to do this both in the church and in the world. No one is to be able to point to us and accuse or blame us for anything. We are to be clean, unpolluted, spotless, holy, righteous, and pure before the world and God.

We are to work at being harmless. It is the idea of flour or grain passing through a sieve to separate the pure from the impure. It means that our thought and lives are not to be polluted by watching, reading, and listening to worldly and sexual attractions. We’re not to be given over to worldly and sexual attractions. Our thoughts and lives are to be pure, clean, uncontaminated, and unpolluted. How can we do this? By being obedient to the Word of God.

Think of it this way: *The theory that is used for mixing paint at a hardware store is really quite simple: the more colored tint that you add to the can of white paint, the darker the paint will become.*

It only takes a drop of black tint to change the color of pure white to off-white. Once that first drop of tint goes into the can of white paint, it can never be taken out. That can of paint will never be pure white again; it can only get darker.

A Christian can work at being pure. True, sin is sin and that cannot be denied. But unlike the tainted can of white paint, the Christ has hope in this great truth: “Create in me a clean heart and renew a right spirit within me: Psalm 51:10

Literally, God makes something out of nothing and gives to people who are truly repentant of their sins a brand new start. In other words, He forgets about the impure can of white paint. “Though your sins be as scarlet, He makes us as white as snow” Isaiah 1:18

From that point on, it is up to us what we do with our *fresh* can of paint. Will we give into willfulness or will we be obedient? Which will you choose?
